Report to the Board: Criminal Investigations Branch

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During March, 2019 Detectives in the Criminal Investigation Branch conducted investigations relating to Sexual assault, Child Abuse, Sudden Death, Thefts, Wanted Persons and Drug offences.

Between January and March 2019 multiple thefts were reported to Owen Sound Police from residents of a local retirement home. On March 15, 2019 an investigation conducted by the Criminal Investigations Branch was concluded with the arrest of a 48 year old Owen Sound women who was employed at the home. Numerous jewelry items of residents were recovered in the investigation both from the possession of the accused and from a pawn shop in Barrie, Ontario. The accused was charged with committing multiple thefts and is currently before the courts.

On March 17, 2019 a lone male entered a local pharmacy and told staff that he was committing a robbery. The suspect demanded all of their supply of Fentanyl and Oxycodone. Staff members advised the suspect that they did not have access to any of these powerful opiates and the suspect left the business without further incident. Detectives assisted the Uniform Branch and identified the suspect as 33 year old Owen Sound male. The accused has been arrested and charged with robbery and remains in custody.

On March 19, 2019 Detectives investigated an incident in which an Owen Sound female claimed to have placed a bomb somewhere inside of a business in the 600 block of 2nd Avenue East. The building was evacuated as a precaution and the investigation identified that a 45 year old city resident was responsible for uttering the false threat. The female was charged with uttering the false threat.

Also in March, 2019 three sexual assault investigations were concluded with charges being filed against male offenders.

Between March 19 and March 21 one Detective attended the Crimes Against Women Conference in London, Ontario.



Report to the Board: Drug Enforcement

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The Drugs and Intelligence Unit continues to investigate persons involved in the trafficking of various dangerous drugs in Owen Sound. As in previous months, the focus continues to be on Fentanyl and Crystal Methamphetamine.

In March 2019, the Drug Enforcement Unit provided assistance to the Guelph Police Service regarding a Fentanyl trafficking operation that was supplying Owen Sound with the deadly drug. The Drug Unit arrested local individuals in January 2019 who were returning from Guelph in Possession of Fentanyl for the Purpose of Trafficking. On March 20 Guelph Police arrested the Fentanyl supplier and seized 267 grams of blue and purple Fentanyl with a street value of approximately \$80,000. This investigation continued with Guelph sharing information with the Toronto Police Service. This resulted in Toronto Police seizing 140 grams of additional blue and purple Fentanyl as well as two loaded handguns and \$13,000 cash.

On March 14 the Drug Enforcement Unit and the Criminal Investigations Branch assisted the O.P.P. with the execution of a search warrant on Grey Road 25 in Chatsworth. Police seized 28 grams of Crystal Methamphetamine, several long guns and several rounds of prohibited ammunition.

A Detective attended a one week course at the Ontario Police College regarding Confidential Human Source Management.

RE: DUTIES OF MUNICIPALITIES – ACCESSIBLE TAXICABS

Background:

The Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (2005) was established to introduce standards to make various aspects of life in Ontario more accessible for persons with disabilities. Regulations made under the Act require small and large organizations in the private and public sectors to meet the developed standards with the goal of attaining full accessibility by the year 2025.

The Owen Sound Police Service is committed to meeting the accessibility needs of persons with disabilities.

The Integrated Accessibility Standards Regulation made under AODA lay out a number of requirements that both small and large organizations in the private and public sectors must comply with. Sections 79 to 80 of Part IV of this Regulation speak to transportation standards and outline the duties of municipalities and taxicabs. Since the Owen Sound Police Services Board regulates the taxicabs and the taxicab bylaw for the municipality, you will be required to address these requirements.

Section 80 of the Regulation speaks to:

- (1) The prohibition of owners and operators charging more for a person with a disability.**
- (2) Vehicle Registration and Identification information must be on the rear bumper of the taxicab.**
- (3) Taxicab Agents/Owner and Drivers must make vehicle registration and identification information available in an accessible format if requested.**

That section has already been addressed in the amendments that were made to taxi by-law section 11.

Section 79 of the Regulation states:

- (1) Every municipality shall consult with its municipal accessibility advisory committee, where one has been established in accordance with subsection 29(1) and (2) of the Act, the public and persons with disabilities to determine the proportion of on-demand accessible taxicabs required in the community.**
- (2) Every municipality shall identify progress made toward meeting the need for on-demand accessible taxicabs, including any steps that will be taken to meet the need, in its accessibility plan required under Part 1.**
- (3) Municipalities shall meet the requirements of this section by January 1, 2013.**

(4) In this section, "accessible taxicab" means an accessible taxicab as defined in section 1 of Regulation 629 of the Revised Regulations of Ontario, 1990 (Vehicles for the Transportation of Physically Disabled Persons) made under the Highway Traffic Act.

The Owen Sound Police Services Board, in consultation with the municipality's Accessibility Advisory Committee, the public, and persons with disabilities, must determine the proportion of on-demand accessible taxicabs required in the community.

The Owen Sound Police Services Board must identify progress made toward meeting the need for on-demand accessible taxicabs, including any steps that will be taken to meet the need, in its accessibility plan required under Part 1. This will be reported to the City's AODA Lead Team and be part of the City of Owen Sound's Accessibility Plan.

In 2014, the City's AODA Lead Team did hold meetings with the Accessibility Advisory Committee and the public. Input was made that they felt the City of Owen Sound should have on-demand accessible taxicabs however due to the fact that the taxicab business is a private entity there nothing a municipality can do to force that companies have a fully accessible taxicab in their fleet.

Recommendation:

The City of Owen Sound AODA's Plan was set for 2014 to 2018 and therefore the City's AODA Lead Team is now reviewing the previous plan in order to update the plan. The City's AODA Lead Team will once again be presenting at the Accessibility Advisory Committee meeting in May 2019.

The Owen Sound Police Service will be presenting on sections 79 and 80 of the Regulation. As stated above in section 79(2) of the Regulation, **Every municipality shall identify progress made toward meeting the need for on-demand accessible taxicabs, including any steps that will be taken to meet the need, in its accessibility plan required under Part 1.** The Owen Sound Police Services Board should consider this requirement and look at options to meet these requirements. One suggestion would be to offer an incentive in the By-law that the licencing fee would be waived in the event that a company licences an accessible taxicab. Other options and incentives should also be explored by The Board.

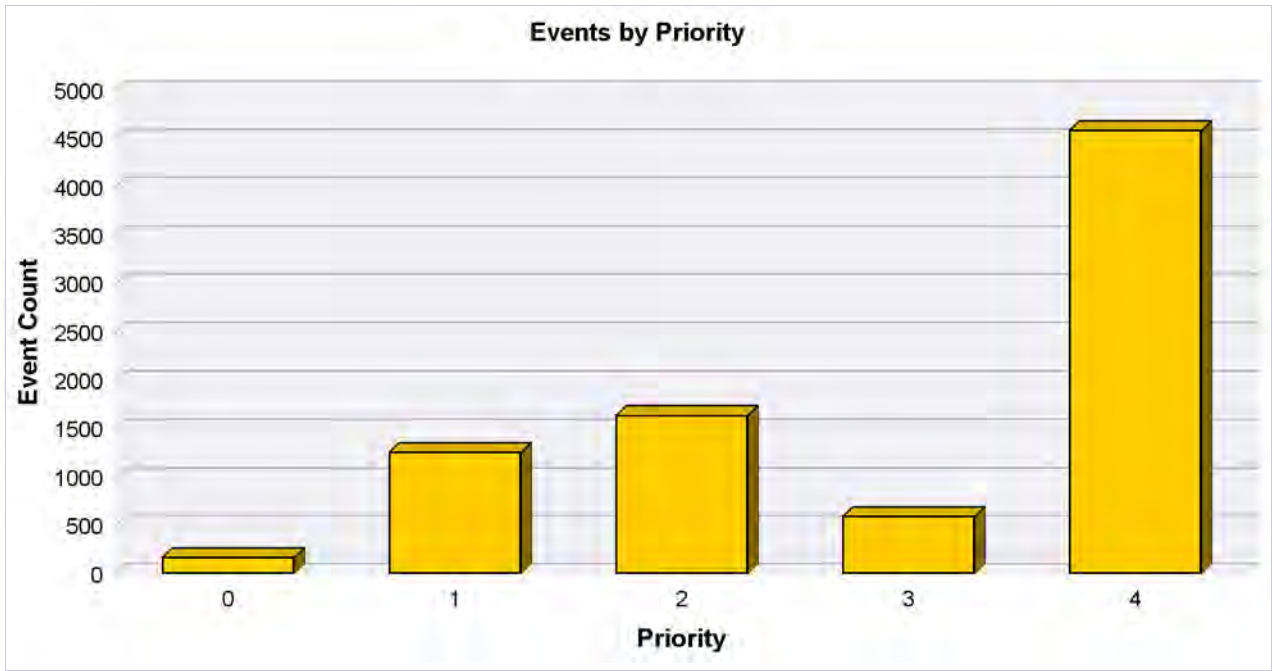

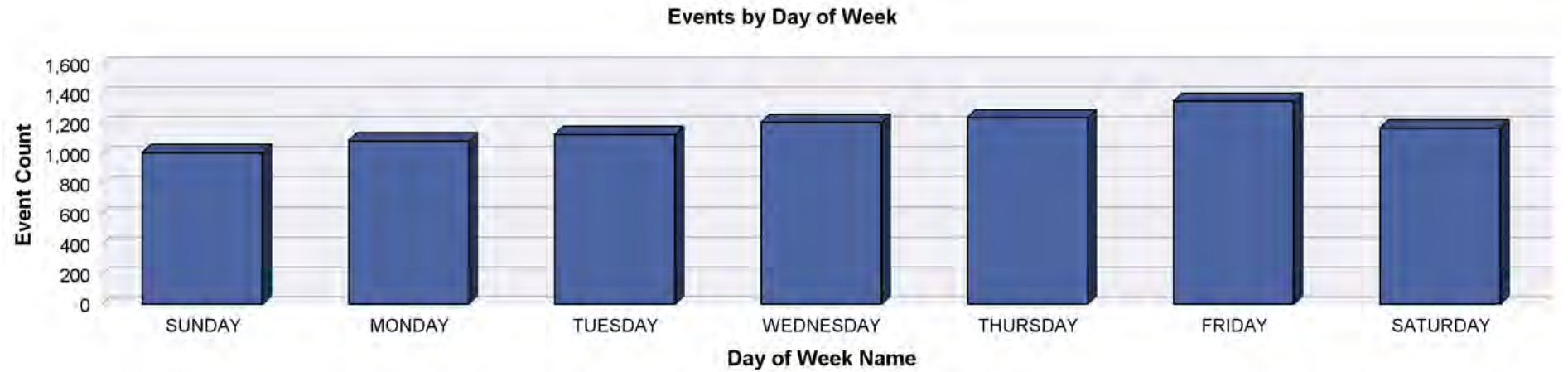

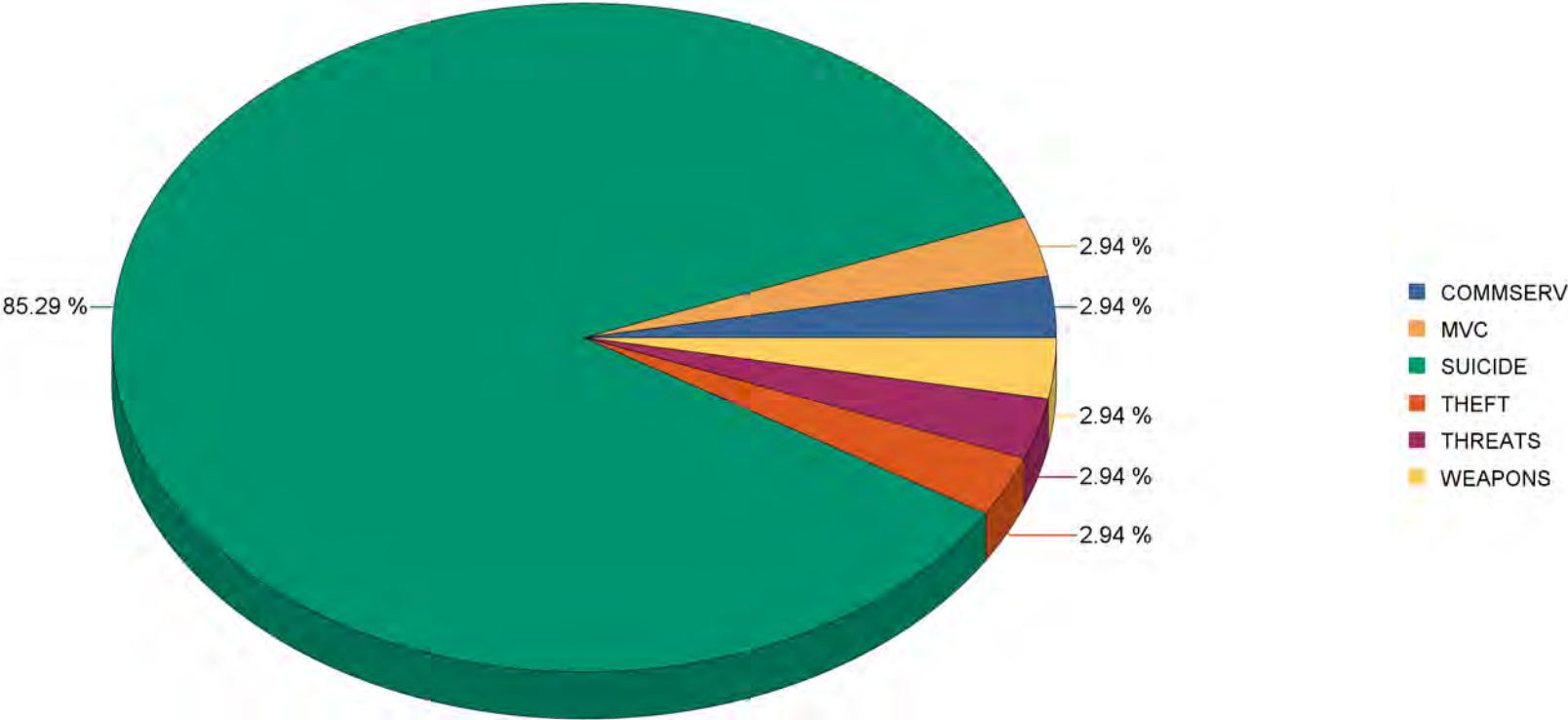

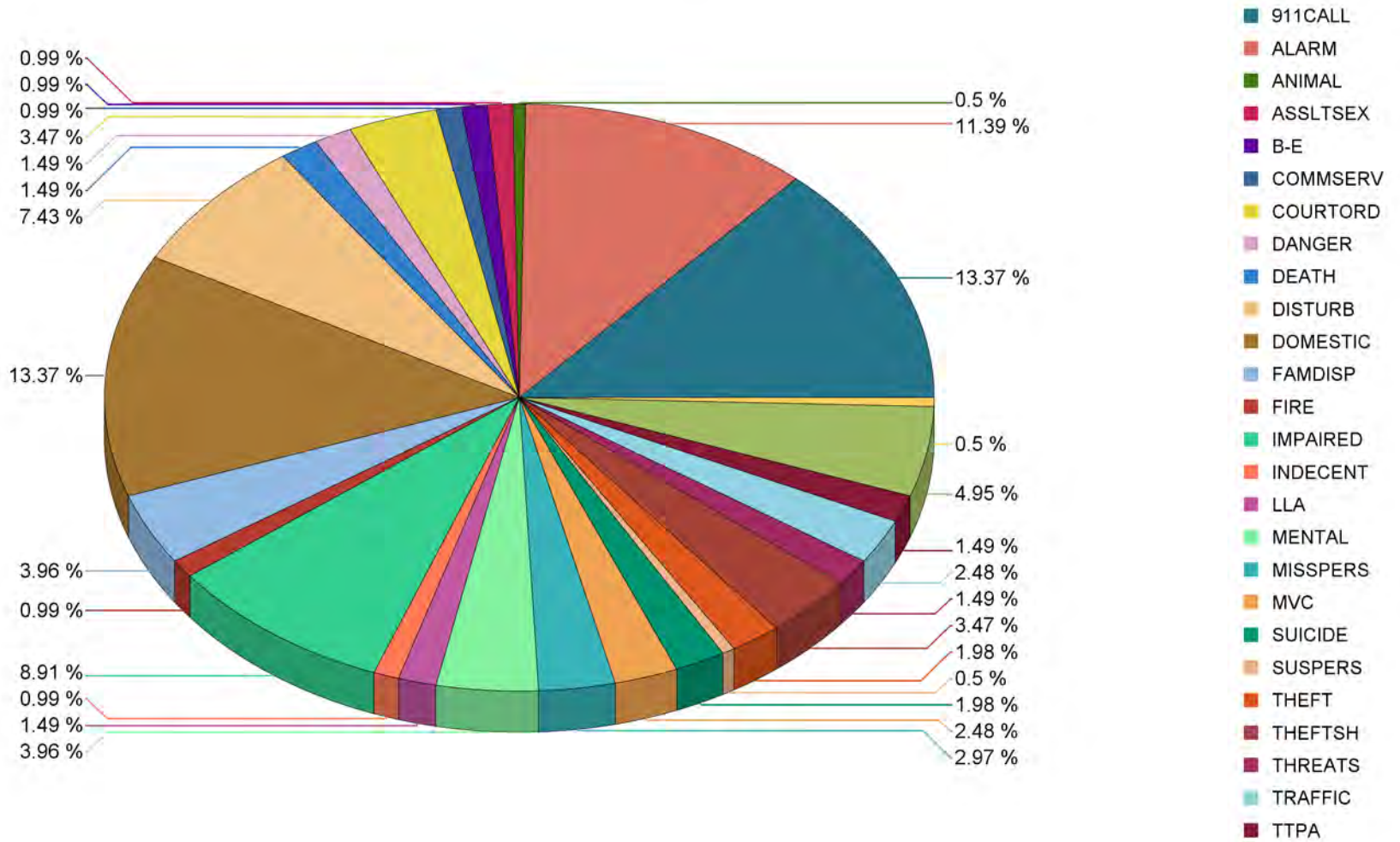

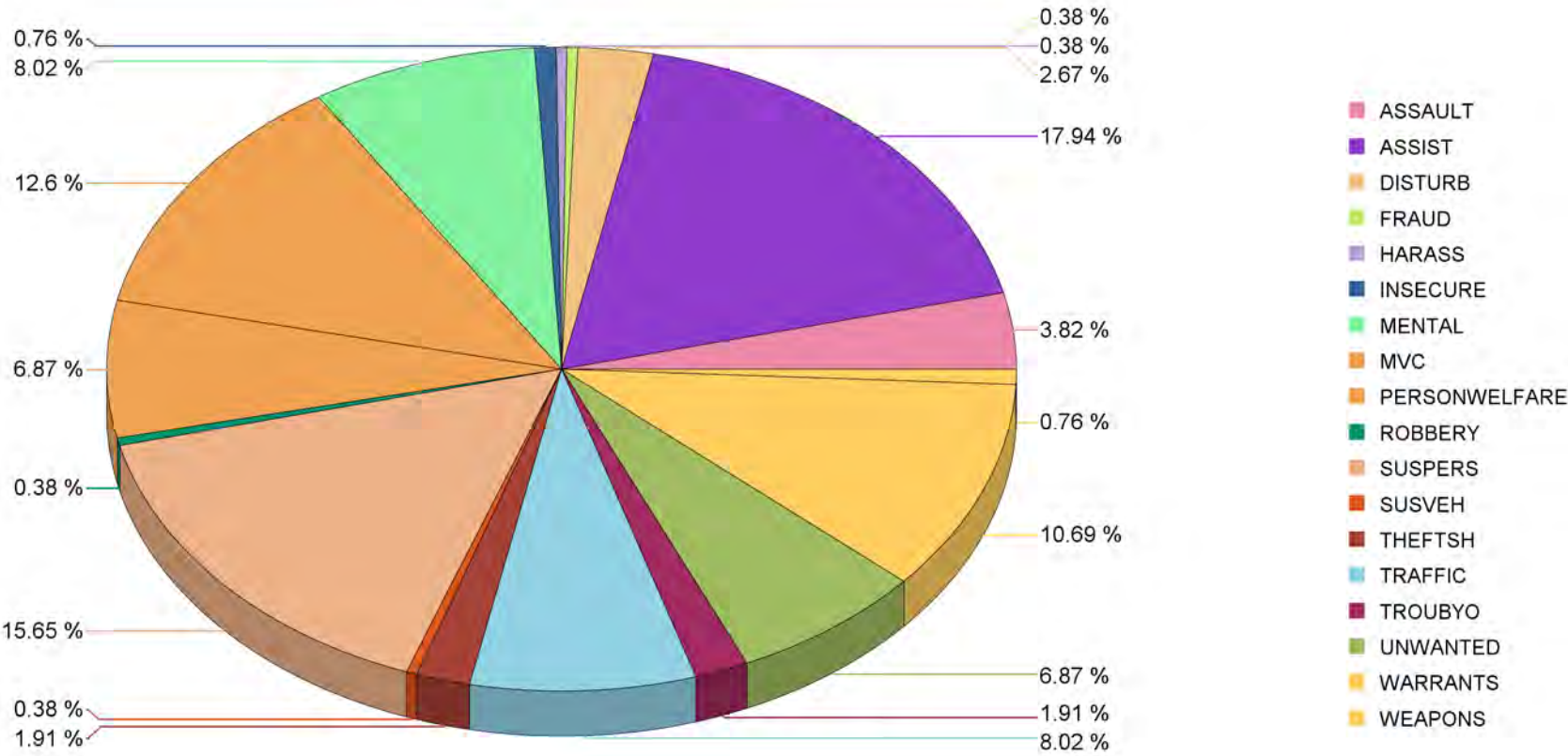

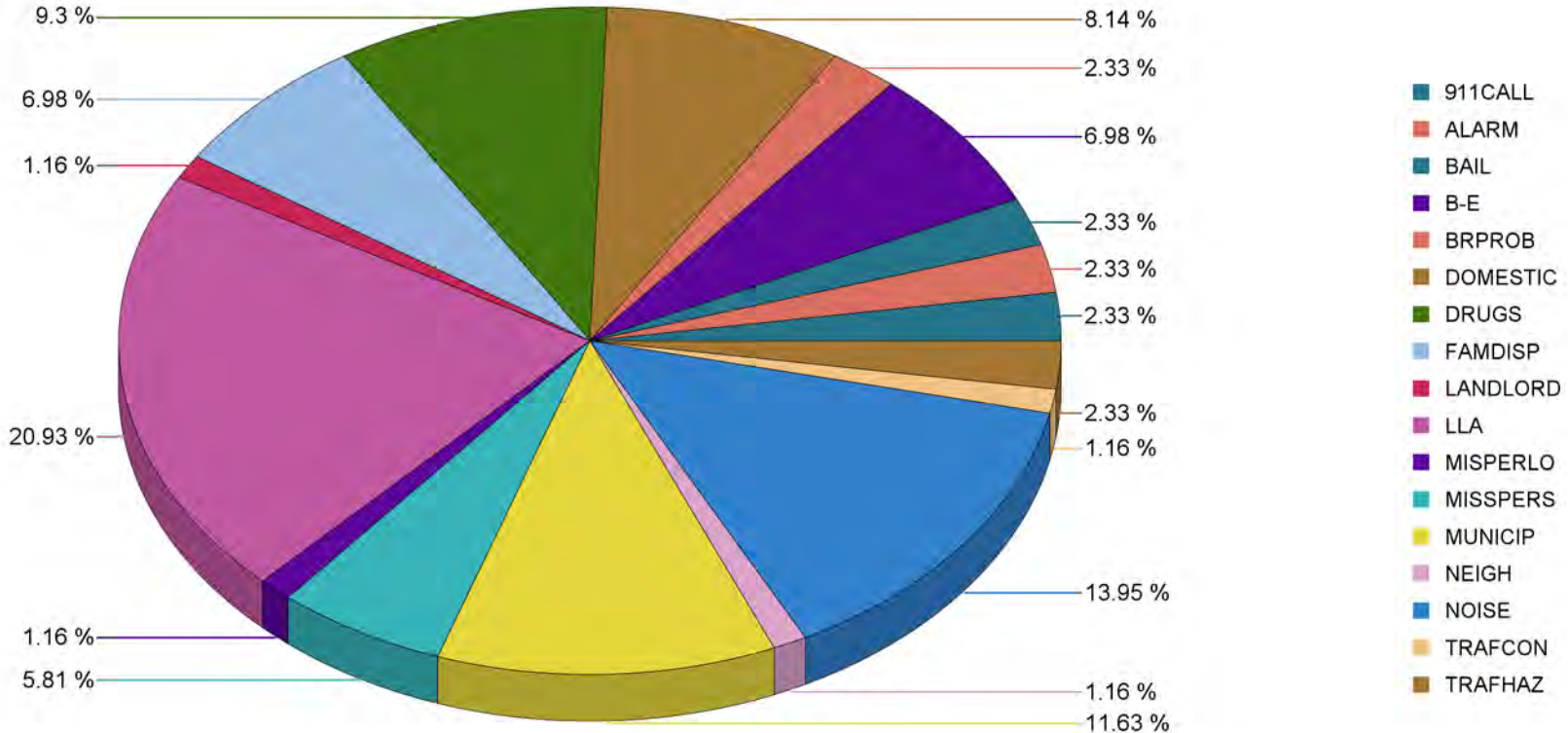

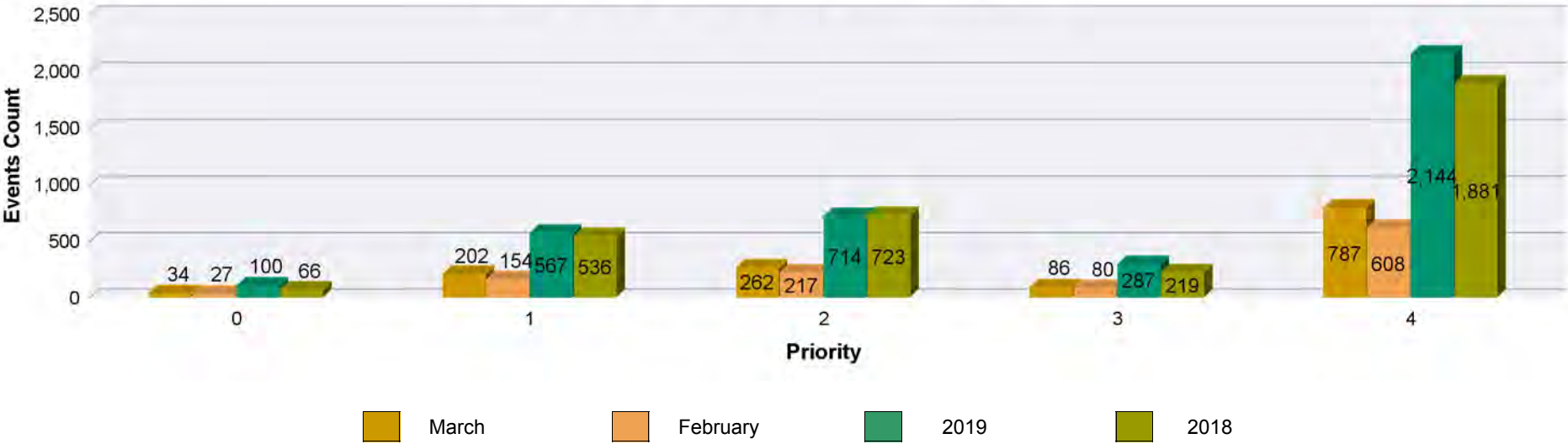

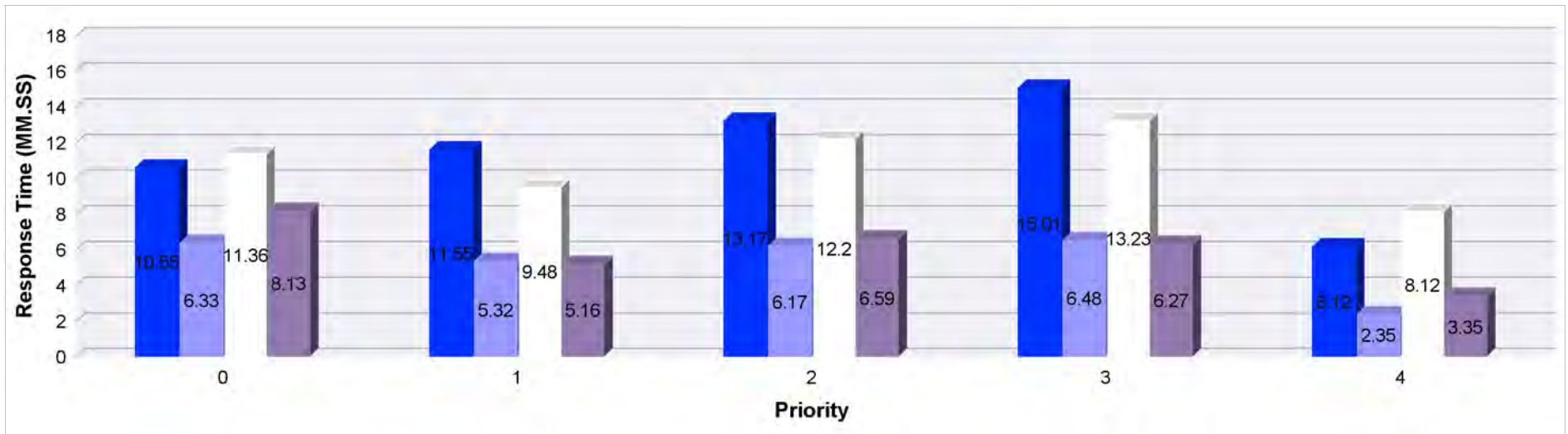

March Vs. February Response Times Comparisons



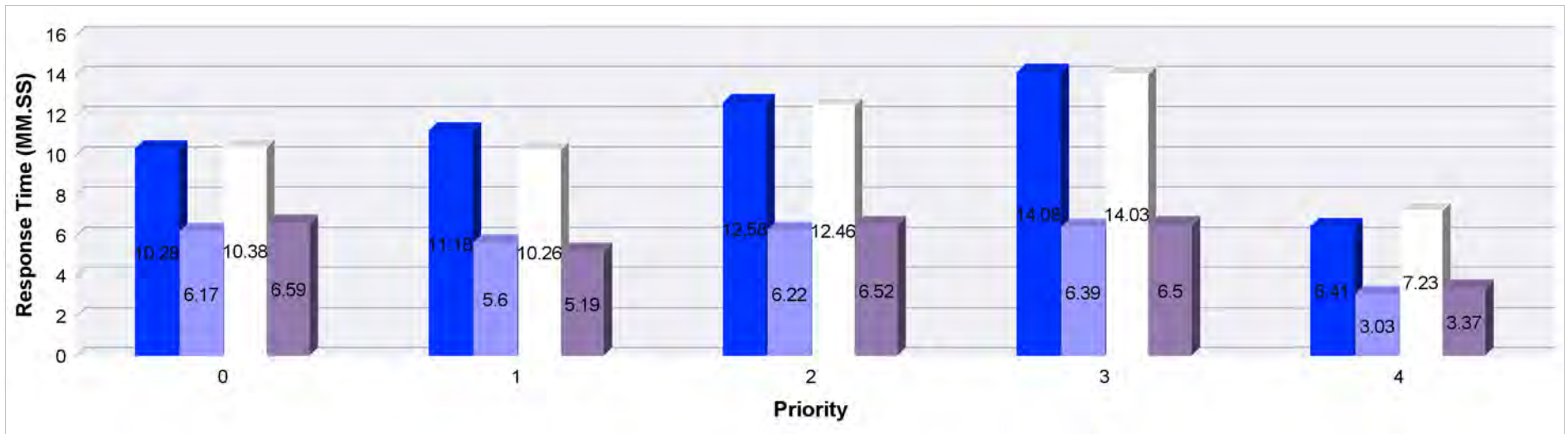
